Approach to social protection

- link social protection back to development and social theory (and ethics)
- a global approach, grounded on regional pathways
- ...with a focus on the poorest

Key findings

- Scale
 - new social protection programmes have the capacity to achieve the scale needed to have a global impact on poverty
- Scope
 - the extension of social protection builds on multidimensional perspectives on poverty and vulnerability
 - ...and especially duration
 - integration of social protection with access to services and growth-mediating processes
- Constraints
 - Politics, finance (in low income countries), and delivery capacity
