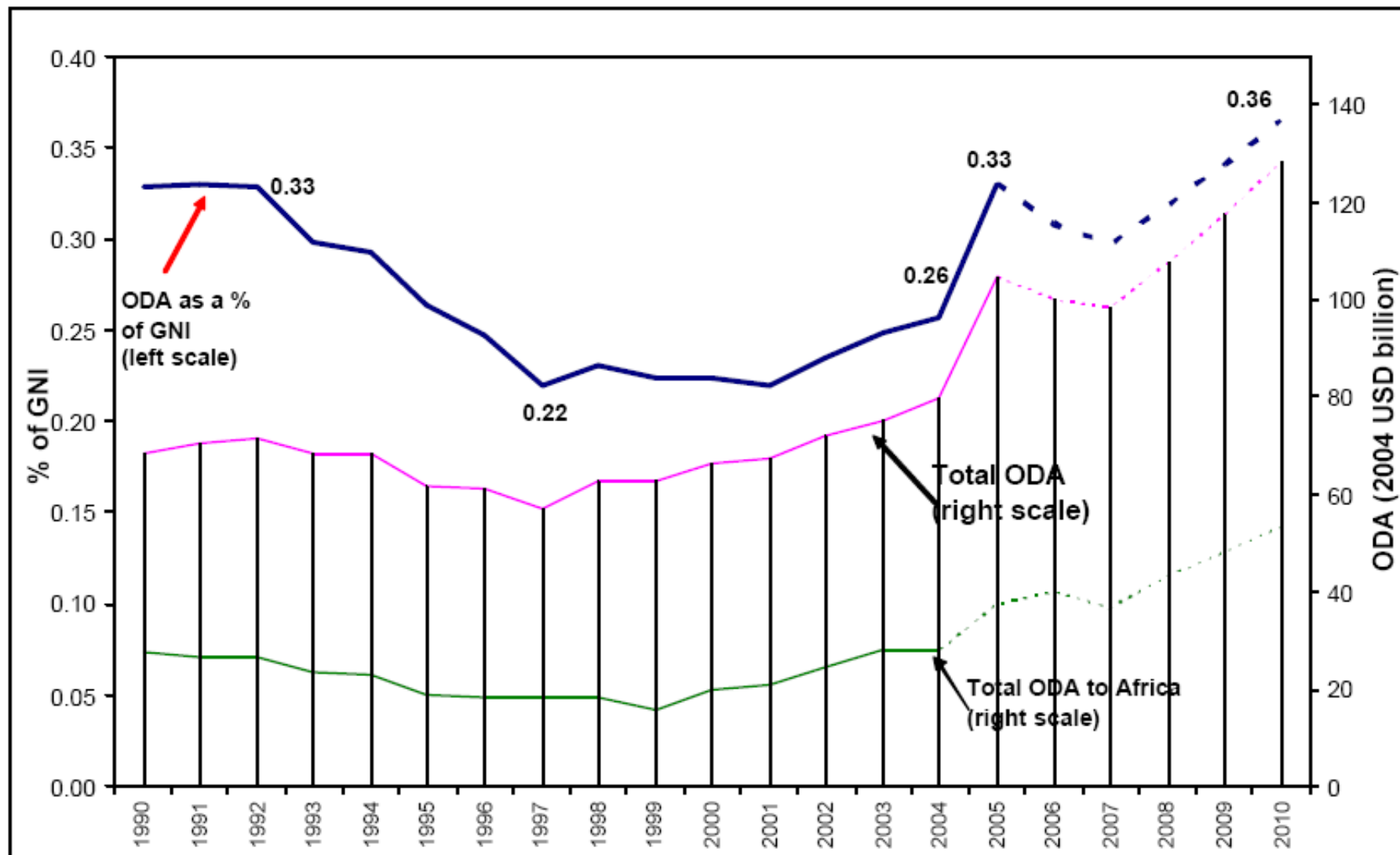

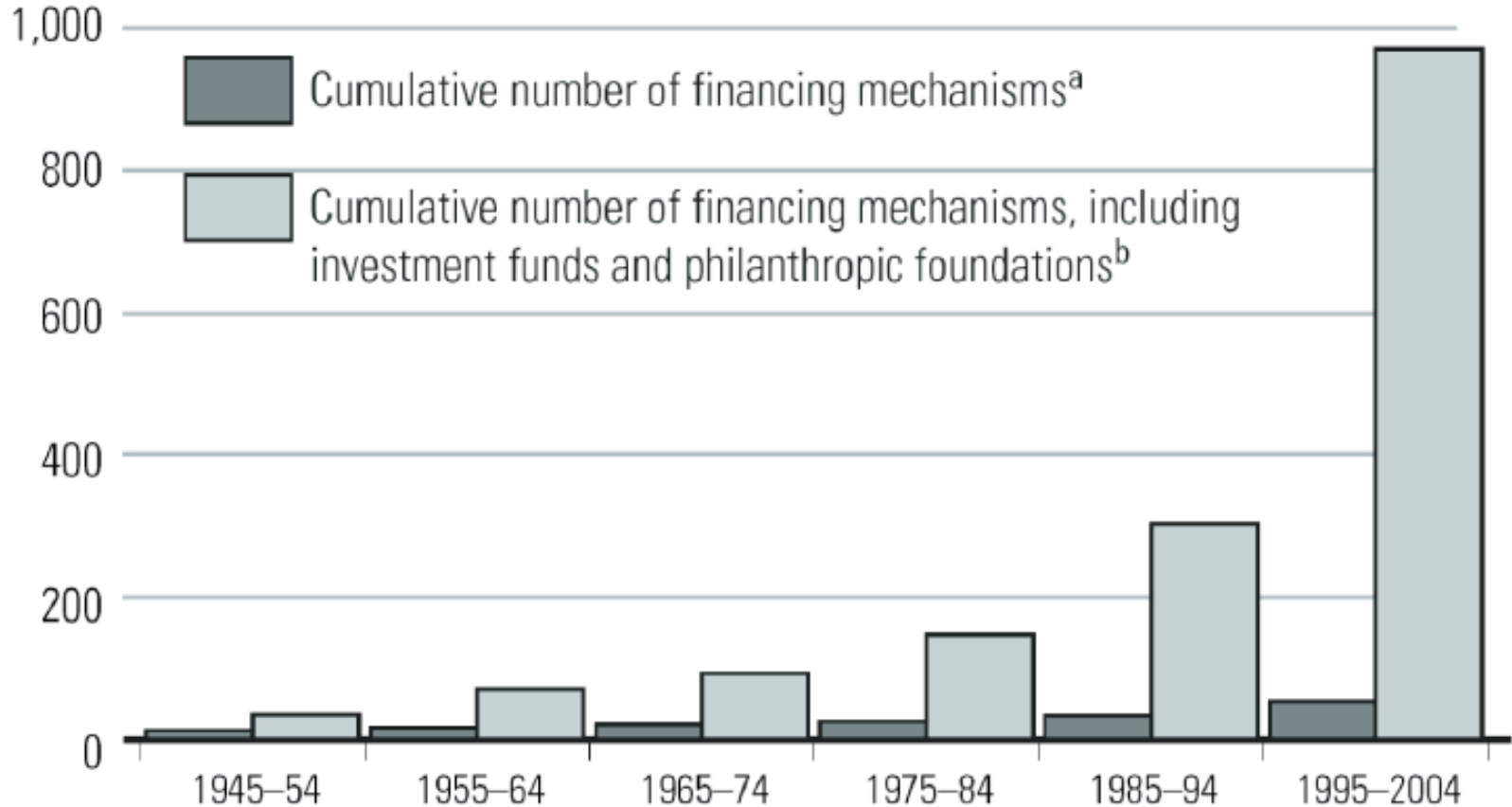

- Aid relationships

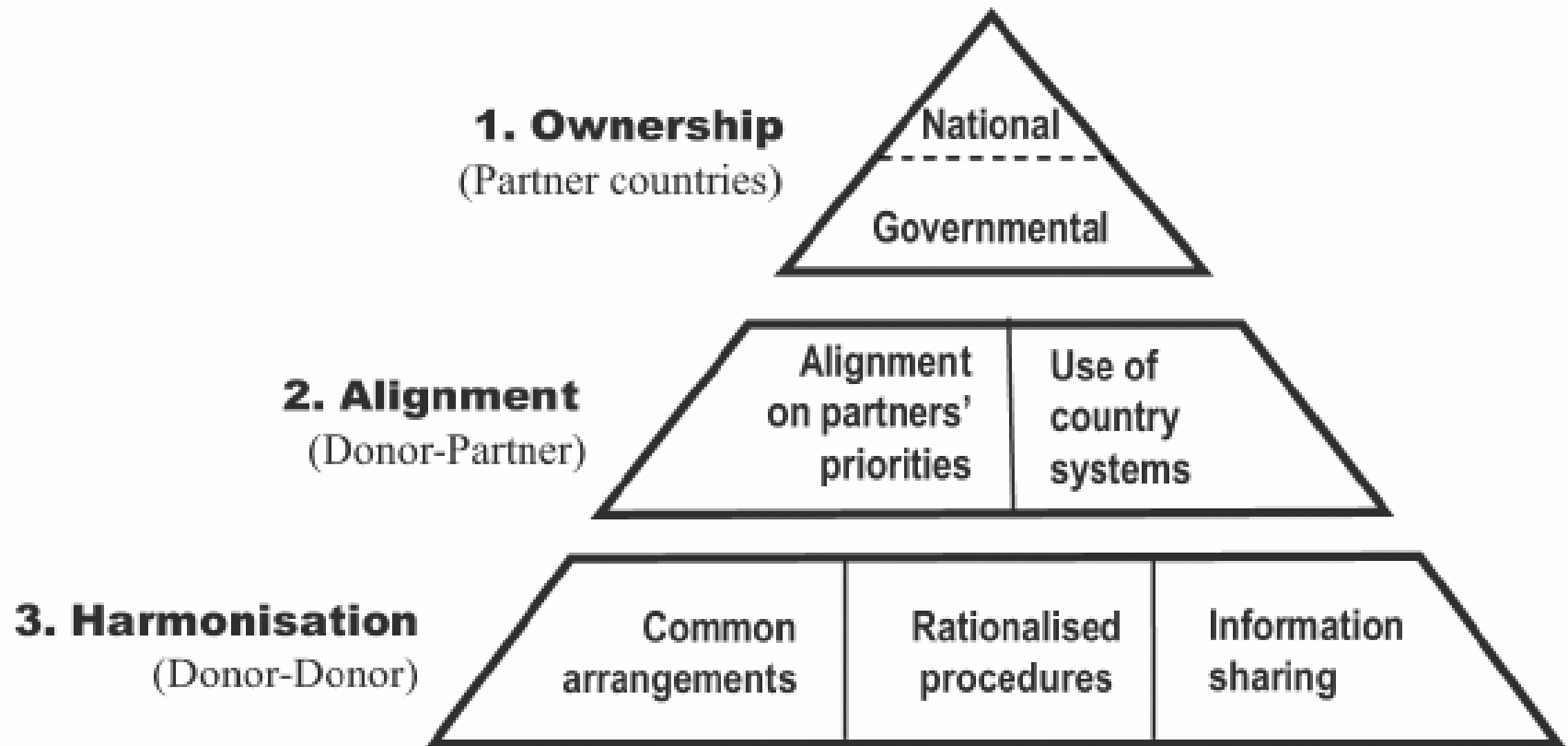
# The Problems

- There are 90 global health funds
- Ghana has 17 major donors in the health sector
- Uganda had over 1050 aid instruments over the period 2003 – 2006
- The average country receives 200 donor missions a year
- Mozambique has over 1000 bank accounts
- 11 UN Agencies provide 2% of Vietnamese aid
- 80% of projects underway are for less than \$1m
- St. Vincent monitors 191 indicators on HIV/AIDS
