### Former Director of ODI awarded OBE

Tony Killick, one of the UK's leading development economists, and a former Director of ODI, has been awarded an OBE in the Honours List published today, 16 June.

Speaking in London, Simon Maxwell, ODI's current Director, said:

'Tony Killick has been an inspiration to many of us in the profession. He is someone who combines a deep commitment to Africa with the highest level of economic skills. His contributions have ranged from national development strategy to international economic policy-making. His critiques of structural adjustment and of conditionality by the international financial institutions remain highly relevant today. He was Director of ODI during a crucial period of the Institute's development, from 1982 to 1987. He was also President of the Development Studies Association between 1986 and 1988. Holding the first of those posts, and having held the second, I know from the inside how much Tony's contribution is valued. We are proud that he remains an active Senior Research Associate of the Institute.'

Tony Killick said:

'I am delighted with this honour. Above all, it reflects the high quality of the research team of the Overseas Development Institute, of which I was fortunate to be a member. I hope this recognition also serves to further highlight the cause of African economic development and the need for an evidence-driven approach to that.'

1. Tony Killick was born in 1934. He was a Lecturer in the Economics Department of the University of Ghana from 1961-65, and then a Tutor in Economics at Ruskin College, Oxford (1965-67). He worked in Ghana and Kenya and for the British aid ministry (then the Overseas Development Administration), before joining ODI in 1979. He is currently a Senior Research Associate of the Institute. Tony Killick is the author of 15 books and very many articles and other publications. He is in constant demand as an adviser and consultant.
